Terry Kennedy is a longtime Las Vegas native and the president and CEO of Appreciation Financial. The birth of Appreciation Financial happened in a classroom. After seeing teachers fall victim to bad financial advice, Kennedy decided to educate the educators about protecting their hard-earned investments. That personal mission led him to start Appreciation Financial in 2008. In the years following, Kennedy has visited more

than 1,000 schools and has personally helped nearly 2,000 teachers plan for a vibrant life after the final bell rings.

Q: What are you reading?
